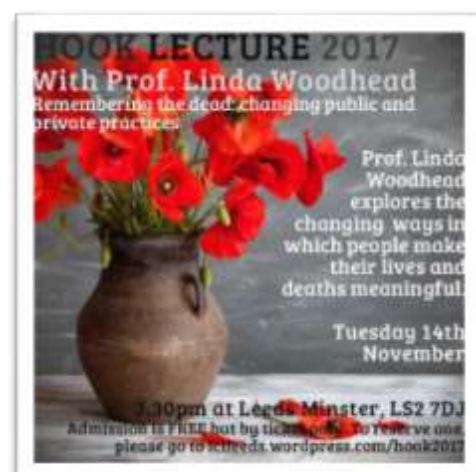
## HOOK LECTURE – REMEMBERING THE DEAD
