A Quiet Day to consider and share some thoughts on where we 'meet' God.

Using the Biblical image of the Tent of Meeting as a source of inspiration we will explore experiences of encountering God in our everyday lives.

Such encounters can sometimes come as life-changing revelations or as more gentle changes in awareness. Can we 'extend the cords of our tent' to spread the love of God in the world?



There will be time throughout the day for private reflection and also for sharing thoughts with others. Maggie will present varied images, texts and some of her own poems to guide our reflection.

In our ordinary lives we can have extraordinary encounters with and glimpses of the Holy One – through other people, nature, scripture, prayer, through sorrow and joy.
