

The history of Markenfield Hall is intertwined with the abortive Rising of the North in 1569, which ruined the fortunes of the de Markenfield family. The Rising attempted to roll back the tide of the Protestant religion, depose Elizabeth I and replace her with Mary, Queen of Scots. Sir Thomas de Markenfield was one of the main instigators of the plot. On 20 November 1569, a large contingent of rebels met at Markenfield Hall. They heard Mass in the chapel before setting out on their ultimately fruitless attempt to overthrow the queen.

By January the rebellion had failed and great numbers had been hanged as traitors in Ripon Market Place where a plaque commemorates the events.

MARKENFIELD HALL - Hell Wath Lane, Ripon, HG4 3AD, 1 mile south of Ripon on the A61.

By car - The drive to Markenfield Hall is a narrow country lane. It is well signposted and very easy to find. The drive takes you deep into the countryside, where you approach the Hall through a cluster of farm buildings. There is a large parking area just beside the moat surrounding the Hall.

By public transport - The 36 Ripon/Leeds bus stops on the A61 just by the end of the lane (ask for Hollins Cottages: the lane to the Hall is 200yards towards Harrogate). It takes 8 minutes from Ripon bus station, 48 mins from Leeds and 28 mins from Harrogate). Please show on your reservation form if you would like a lift along the lane to the Hall.
